This Amendment to Memorandum of Agreement (this "Amendment") is executed as of this the day of July, 2007, by and between the Jefferson County Commission, the governing body of Jefferson County, Alabama (the "County Commission"), and the Freshwater Land Trust, an Alabama nonprofit corporation, as successor by change of name to the Black Warrior-Cahaba Rivers Land Trust (the "Land Trust"), and amends that certain Memorandum of Agreement (the "Agreement") dated December 19, 2005, by and between the County Commission and the Black Warrior-Cahaba Rivers Land Trust.

WHEREAS, the Real Estate Purchase Agreement between United States Steel Corporation, as seller, and the Land Trust, as buyer, as identified in the Agreement, has been amended by that certain First Amendment of Real Estate Purchase Agreement (Red

Mountain Park Property) dated as of November 14, 2005, and that certain Second Amendment of Real Estate Purchase Agreement (Red Mountain Park Property) dated as of February 23, 2007 (hereinafter collectively called the "USS Purchase Agreement").

WHEREAS, the Land Trust assigned all of its right, title and interest in and to the USS Purchase Agreement to the Red Mountain Greenway and Recreational Area Commission, an agency of the State of Alabama, pursuant to that certain Assignment and Assumption Agreement dated as of February 23, 2007; and

WHEREAS, the County Commission and the Land Trust desire to amend the Agreement to reflect the assignment of the USS Purchase Agreement and the revised terms to which the parties have agreed.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Agreement is hereby amended as follows:

- 1. The Agreement shall reflect that, as permitted pursuant to recital C of the Agreement, the Land Trust has assigned its rights as buyer under the USS Purchase Agreement to the Red Mountain Greenway and Recreational Area Commission, an agency of the State of Alabama.

Whereas application for these funds requires entering into a Memorandum of Understanding with the City of Birmingham to equally share the block of funds made available through recognition of Jefferson County and the City of Birmingham as disparate jurisdictions.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that Jefferson County Commission approves application for the 2008 Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) and authorizes the President to sign the Memorandum of Understanding.

Motion was made by Commissioner Langford seconded by Commissioner Humphryes that the above resolution be adopted. Voting "Aye" Langford, Humphryes, Carns, Collins and Smoot.
