### ASSIGNMENT AND ASSUMPTION AGREEMENT

THIS ASSIGNMENT AND ASSUMPTION AGREEMENT (this "Agreement") is dated as of October 5, 2007, by and among the Federal Home Loan Bank of Atlanta ("Bank), Jefferson Co. Comm., Office of Comm. Devel. ("Project Sponsor"), Regions Bank ("Assignor") and New South Federal Savings Bank ("Assignee").

WHEREAS, Bank, Project Sponsor and Assignor entered into that certain Affordable Housing Program Agreement for Owner Occupied (Direct Subsidy) dated effective as of December 18, 2006 and attached as Exhibit "A" (as amended, the "AHPAgreement").

WHEREAS, Assignor wishes to withdraw as the "Member" (as defined in the AHP Agreement) and to assign and transfer all of its rights and obligations relating to or arising under the Application (as defined in the AHP Agreement) and under the AHP Agreement to Assignee; and

WHEREAS, Assignee wishes to replace Assignor as the "Member" for purposes of the AHP Agreement and to assume all of Assignor's rights and obligations relating to or arising under the Application and the AHP Agreement.

Now THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the foregoing premises, the agreements, representations, warranties and covenants herein contained and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. Assignment and Assumption of Rights and Obligations. Assignor hereby transfers and assigns to Assignee, all of Assignor's right, title and interest in, and all of its obligations under, the Application and the AHP Agreement, and Assignee hereby accepts and assumes all of such right, title and interest in, and obligations under, the Application and the AHP Agreement. Assignee expressly agrees that Assignee shall assume, pay, perform and observe each and every one of the covenants, promises, terms, conditions, obligations, duties and liabilities of Assignor, as Member under the Application and the AHP Agreement, including, without limitation, all obligations and liabilities of Assignor arising prior to the date of this Agreement. Project Sponsor, Assignor and Assignee each hereby covenant and agree that they will execute and deliver to each of the other parties any and all documents required to effect the provisions of the AHP Agreement regarding deed restrictions and retention agreements, including without limitation, any amendments of previously recorded documents. Bank, Project Sponsor, Assignee and Assignor agree that, upon the assignment and assumption of the AHP Agreement as contemplated by this paragraph, the term "Member" for purposes of the Agreement shall mean and refer to Assignee.
- 2. Representations and Warranties. Assignor and Project Sponsor each represent and warrant to the other, to the Bank and to the Assignee that it is not in default with respect to its performance under the AHP Agreement or the Application, that all representations given by it and contained in the Application or the AHP Agreement are true and correct as of the date hereof, and that it is not aware of (i) any default on the part of Bank, or Project Sponsor, or (ii) any set of facts or circumstances which, with the passage of time, would constitute a default under the Application or under the AHP Agreement. Assignee hereby represents and warrants to the parties hereto that each of the representations made by Assignor and contained in the Application or the AHP Agreement are true and correct as of the date hereof, and Assignee hereby reaffirms each and every such representation. Each party represents and warrants that it has full corporate power and authority and has received all corporate and governmental authorizations and approvals as may be required to enter into and perform its obligations under this Agreement and that it will maintain this Agreement as part of its corporate records. In-office hours will be 6:30 A.M. to 10:00 P.M. as requested by the Family Court. On-call / home office coverage will be provided for the remainder of the twenty-four (24) hour period.

- Provide feedback and outcome data to court
- Maintenance of appropriate policies and procedures to meet the needs of the court
- Ability to maintain and monitor up to 200 active clients

Contractor will provide a total of five (5) fulltime and three (3) parttime staff with a float pool of per hour, partially benefited staff to provide coverage on an as needed basis. Full time and part time staff will consist of the following:

- One full-time Program Administrator
- One full-time Assistant Administrator
- Two full-time day Birmingham staff
- One full-time Bessemer staff

- One part-time, weeknight staff
- Two part-time, weekend staff

Benefits for fulltime and parttime staff will be provided by the Contractor as dictated by the corresponding job classification. 5,834 float pool hours will be budgeted for as needed coverage. Positions will be filled to meet the needs of the current client caseload. All budgeted positions and float pool coverage hours will not be utilized unless the caseload reaches 200 and maximum coverage is required for adequate coverage.   - Maintenance of databases for reporting and research purposes.
  - Case management for urinalysis and for Drug Court.
  - Referral to residential treatment when appropriate.
  - Collection of client fees as ordered (client fees collected in connection with the programs supported by this contract shall be accounted for, carried forward and used only for these programs).
- 2. UAB shall provide such services at the campus of the Family Court and shall keep office hours equal to eight hours per day, Monday through Friday, in space provided by the Jefferson County Commission.
- 3. The County agrees to provide office space at Family Court, operational equipment, supplies, and furniture.

- 4. It is expressly understood that UAB shall provide all clerical support for the services at no cost to the Jefferson County Commission.
- 5. The Jefferson County Commission shall compensate UAB for services rendered under the terms and conditions of this contract as specified in Attachment A which is made a part of this agreement by reference.
- 6. The term of this contract shall be from October 1, 2007 through September 30, 2008 or until \$294,748.59 is billed and paid, whichever comes first. It is also understood that the Court shall provide no additional amount for fringe benefits (vacation/sick leave, health insurance, etc.).
- 7. It is understood that each party shall evaluate whether it wishes to continue to contract for these services after the period of this agreement and a separate written agreement must be executed between the parties to continue the contractual relationship.
- 8. Funds for the above services will be paid from the Family Court of Jefferson County operating budget for fiscal year 2007-08. UAB agrees to submit a monthly itemized invoice to the Jefferson County Commission adjusted for services not actually provided. - 9. UAB will submit a quarterly report containing program data to be specified by the Court.
- 10. All services rendered by UAB under his contract shall be rendered in accordance with the Court's standard procedures for providing of said services.
- 11. It is hereby agreed that either party may terminate this contract with a thirty (30) day written notice, served on the other party, by the party wishing to terminate.
- 12.UAB is obligated for workmen's compensation or equivalent, FICA taxes, all applicable federal state and local taxes, etc., and the Jefferson County Commission will not be obligated for same under this contract.
- 13. For purposes of this contract, UAB, its employees, officers, agents or representatives shall not be considered as agents, officers or representatives of the County. UAB acknowledges and understands that the performance of this contract is as an independent contractor. ## AGREEMENT

## RECITAL:

Alabama law requires Jefferson County to pay specified annual compensation to the Birmingham and Bessemer District Attorneys and their deputies. The law also requires the State to pay a portion of the compensation for the District Attorneys and for some of the Deputy District Attorneys. Where the compensation responsibility is divided between the County and the State, the Attorneys' pension membership is also divided between the County pension and the State pension. Through this Agreement, the parties establish an option for the District Attorneys and the Deputy District Attorneys to elect to have the County provided compensation, pension contribution and health insurance amounts for single or family coverage paid directly to the Office of Prosecution Services (OPS) and merged with the State provided compensation and paid to the Deputy District Attorney on the OPS payroll so that the entire compensation may be considered for the State pension.

# WITNESSETH:

IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PREMISES, Jefferson County (the County), the District Attorney and the Deputy District Attorney agree as set out below:

<u>Definition:</u> As used herein the term "County provided compensation/benefits" shall mean:

- a) The respective salary amounts for DDA's established by legislative act (and as amended) applicable to the Birmingham and Bessemer District Attorneys Offices and directed to be payable by Jefferson County as salary compensation;
  - b) An amount equal to 3% of the salary compensation representing an employer pension match;
- c) An amount equal to 86% of the amount paid by the State toward the cost of State health insurance for either single or family coverage elected by the DDA.
- \* In accordance with past practice, the County shall include an amount for FICA upon the condition that the County will be reimbursed by the State.
- 1) By execution below, the Deputy District Attorney hereby elects to have his County-provided compensation/benefits paid directly to the Office of Prosecution Services and merged with his State-provided compensation and paid to him on the OPS payroll.
- 2) By execution below, the District Attorney hereby endorses and approves the above election of the Deputy District Attorney.
- 3) The County hereby agrees to make monthly payments of the County-provided compensation/benefits directly to the Office of

Prosecution Services for merger with the State-provided compensation and paid to the Deputy District Attorney on the OPS payroll.

- 4) The amount initially to be paid by the County is set out on the attachment. Provided however, the amounts shall be automatically amended to reflect changes in the compensation to be paid by the County; i.e., the annual step raises and promotions for Deputy District Attorneys and changes in insurance coverage and the amount paid by the State.
- 5) This Agreement may be terminated by any party upon two months prior written notice to the other parties.
- The effective date of this Agreement shall be July 1, 1999, or upon the effective date of the undersigned DDA's election, if later.
